

Project Reach Out Personalized Bathroom Kits are Part of San Francisco's Stake Women's Conference

Over 200 women from the San Francisco Stake Relief Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints gathered Saturday, March 1, 2008, for a service event and conference. Project Reach Out (PRO) was one of the three charitable organizations that benefitted from this activity.

The Relief Society completed over 50 personalized bathroom kits for children in the Kiversti, Western Ukraine, orphanage. Each kit includes individualized soap dish and soap, toothbrush, paste and holder, high quality hooded towel set and a personalized shoulder bags sewn that morning by women attending the conference.

“Making these bathroom kits for the Ukrainian orphanages allowed everyone to get involved in a very worthy cause,” says

Debbie Grewal, San Francisco Stake Relief Society President and event coordinator. “Women could use their creative skills and decorate soap and toothbrush holders, sew hooded towels and bag sets, or help out by purchasing items,” she adds.



The bathroom kits will be delivered the end of March, 2008.

Additional supplies, including contents for 26 more bathroom kits, clothing, food and medicines will also be distributed at that time.

Sarah Shipp, a child adopted from the Lutsk, Western Ukraine orphanage in 2001, made a cameo appearance at the event and thanked all those who participated and donated to PRO. Shipp performed a piano musical number dedicated to “all the children without mommies and daddies.”
